The Colfax County Board of Commissioners met on this date in a Special Session in the Commission Chambers with the following members present:

1. Call to Order

Chairman Sauble called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

County Manager Kern led the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. Salute to the New Mexico Flag

Commissioner Newton led the Salute to the New Mexico Flag.

4. Recognized Visitors

5. Discuss/Action – Canvass the November 2018 General Election Results

Chairman Sauble stated the reason for the Special Meeting is for Canvassing November 6, 2018 General Election Results. County Clerk Rayetta Trujillo stated the Provisional Ballots were verified as eligible voters, which did not vote in their assigned precinct, and will be presented to the Board for approval. County Clerk Trujillo stated there were nine provisional Ballots received and recommended only seven of them be counted. She requested two of the Provisional Ballots be rejected due to the voters not being registered. County Clerk Trujillo stated one voter registered on October 30<sup>th</sup> and the other voter registered on Election Day. Commissioner Newton questioned the registration deadline date. Chairman Sauble stated the deadline to register was on October 9<sup>th</sup> and County Clerk Trujillo confirmed the deadline date.

The Commission tallied the seven Provisional Ballots and Canvassed by Precinct in the 2018 General Election and the results for Colfax County are as follows.
